

Judge orders fine, jail term for Fong aide

NEW-YORK (AP) — Robert T. Carson, former aide to Republican Sen. Hiram L. Fong of Hawaii, was sentenced Tuesday to 18 months in jail and fined \$5,000 on his bribe conspiracy conviction in U.S. District Court last November.

Carson, 65, former president of the Honolulu Stock Exchange, was visibly shaken during the sentencing by Judge Marvin E. Frankel.

He was convicted in a jury trial of conspiring to take and offer bribes perverting himself before a grand jury. A former chairman of the Republican party in Honolulu, Carson joined Fong's staff in 1961 and was suspended as the senator's aide when the charges of his wrongdoing came to light.

Frankel said he had received 70 letters urging clemency for Carson, including appeals from four U.S. senators. The judge declined to name them.

The jury of 10 men and two women deliberated for 18 hours before finding Carson guilty last Nov. 20 on two counts of a four-count indictment handed up last Jan. 13. The maximum penalty was five years in prison and a \$10,000 fine on each count.

Carson was convicted of accepting a \$2,500 bribe to help quash stock fraud indictments against Joseph Bald, a Queens, N.Y., interior decorator, and Michael Hellerman, who has pleaded guilty in the subsequent securities case.

Hearing called on proposal for I-505 freeway

A public design hearing on the proposed I-505 freeway corridor through Northwest Portland will be at 2 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 10, in the Portland Civic Auditorium, State Highway officials reported.

The hearing follows action by the federal court last year. The Highway Division was ordered to call the hearing and provide an environmental impact statement to explore alternative routings.

Officials said the impact statement will be available in room 207, State Highway Building, Salem, as well as

in the Metropolitan Engineer's Office, 5821 NE Glisan St., Portland, Friday, Jan. 7. It also will be available at the hearing, and at two informal hearings Feb. 8 and 9, from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m., in the Water Service Building Auditorium, 1800 SW 6th Avenue.

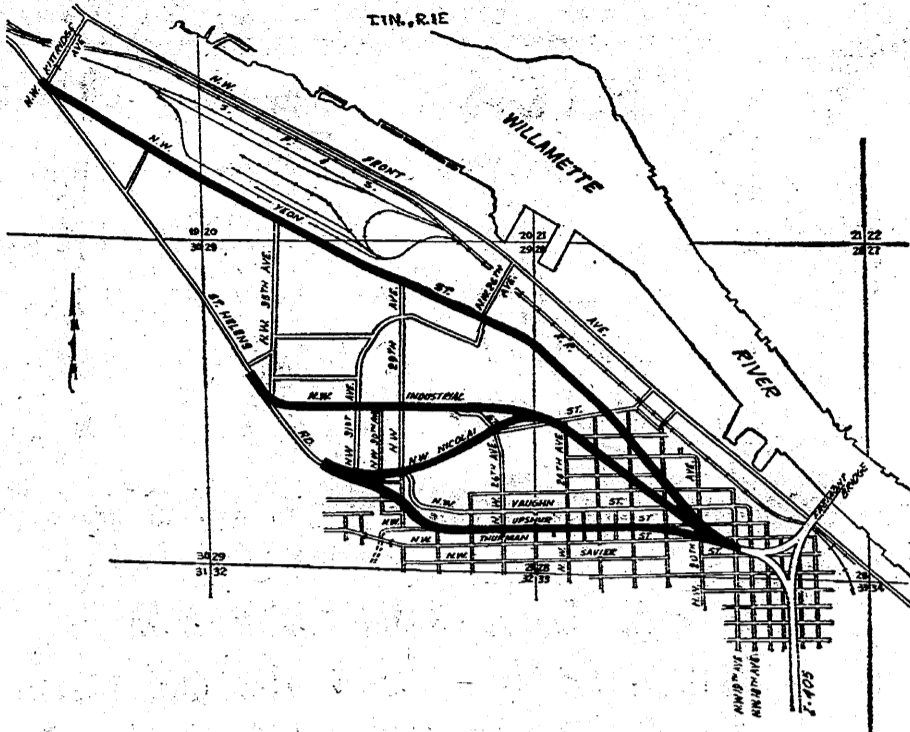
engineer, said three corridor alternatives will be presented, all involving portions of Northwest Portland from the area of NW 19th Avenue — site of the Fremont Bridge off ramps, from I-405 — northwesterly to near NW Kittridge Avenue.

Controversy and subsequent court action have in-

volved highway officials with a number of Northwest neighborhood groups, notably the Northwest District and Willamette Heights neighborhood associations, which have been fighting a predetermination of the corridor west to NW St. Helens Road between NW Thurman and Vaughn streets.

Residents feel the corridor would be disruptive to the predominantly residential community, would displace a number of persons and would accelerate traffic, air and noise pollution.

The area is presently focal point of a city planning study aimed at preserving and revitalizing the neighborhood.

Nunn will take a leave of absence from PP&L during the 1972 campaign, Rep. Wendell Wyatt, chairman of the Nixon Oregon campaign drive, announced.

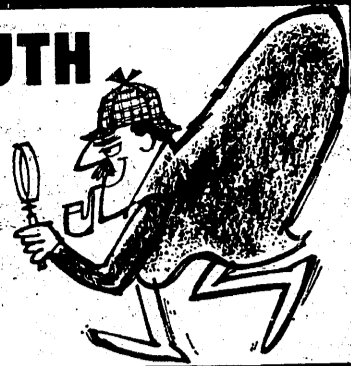
